

St. Mark's Preschool has successfully served children & their families by providing "cost-effective, inclusive preschool education for special needs children & typical children to learn side by side" for 36 years.



# Our weekly Saint of the Week & Nature Note by Marilyn Lance

# **SAINT OF THE WEEK**: Kateri Tekakwitha, Native American Contemplative

This week we honor the first Native American woman to be canonized in the Roman Catholic Church. Kateri was born in 1656 in a Mohawk village in New York State. Her father was a Mohawk chief and her mother was an Algonquin woman captured in a raid and later assimilated into the Mohawk tribe. Kateri's mother was a baptized Roman Catholic. When Kateri was 4 years old her parents died from smallpox and she was left an orphan with a scarred face and poor eyesight. She was adopted by an uncle. When Kareri was 11 she met 3 Jesuit missionaries who influenced her thinking. At 18 she declared that she would only be a bride of Christ and would not marry. After studying catechism for a year with a priest, Kateri was baptized on Easter Sunday 1676 and renamed Catherine after Catherine of Sienna. Her aunt and uncle and many villagers were not happy about her conversion to Christianity so she was forced to move to a more welcoming Christian Indian Mission. Kateri was regarded by the Jesuits as the first Iriquois virgin and known as the "Lily of the Mohawks". She was kind and industrious. She and another native woman explored the possibility of starting a religious order of native women, but the Jesuits were against it. Catherine Tekakwitha died on April 17, 1680 the Wednesday of Holy Week at the age of 24. After her death her scarred face became smooth and white, and other miracles were attributed to her. More than 300 books in more than 20 languages have been published on the life of Kateri Tekakwitha. She was canonized a saint by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012.

# Nature Note - This Is My Property!

This week I've seen male cardinals, mockingbirds, and thrashers fighting. A bird fight is pretty ridiculous. The 2 males face each other on the ground. Then they rush and bump each other. Somehow they know who wins. This is all part of establishing a territory. Territory is a way to ensure that an animal has enough of the essential resources – food, water, protection from enemies and a place to raise young, to reproduce and raise young. We humans identify our property (territory) with fences, hedges and even signs. Mammals usually use scent to mark territory. Anyone who has a dog knows this as their dog marks trees with urine. Most birds have no sense of smell so they use a different method. Besides fighting, many birds fly around the edge of their territory and sing. When I worked in the Tennessee State Parks we would take visitors out at night and play a tape recording of owl calls and wait for the resident owl to come close and challenge. Birds also use visual displays. Watch for mockingbirds dropping their wings to show their white wing patches. Territory is necessary for the survival of the species. It doesn't seem fair to us humans but not every animal gets to find a mate and produce offspring. The strongest individuals, usually the males, stake out a territory that will provide them with enough resources to raise offspring. The males with no territory just don't get to breed. Since different species of birds have different needs, your property is divided into a number of territories. You just can't have two pairs of the same species. If you put up several bluebird houses on your property you will probably have only only one pair of bluebirds. But you may get chickadees, Carolina wrens, titmice, or nuthatches in the other houses. The amazing thing is that somehow the birds know how much territory they need to successfully raise young!
